



<b>Course Name:</b>	<b>Joint child protection response (JCPR) Training Course</b>

<b>Course Description:</b>	<p>NSW Department of Communities and Justice (DCJ) and NSW Police are jointly responsible for investigating allegations of abuse when it is possible that a criminal offence has been committed. Joint Child Protection Response Program (JCPRP) have specifically trained DCJ caseworkers and NSW Police with the specialist skills required to conduct investigative interviews with children and/or young people.</p> <p>NSW Health is an equal partner in JCPRP, and highly skilled and experienced senior health clinicians (SHCs) and health clinicians (HC) are an integral part of JCPRP across NSW. JCPRP training is mandatory for all JCPRP caseworkers, police officers and SHC/HCs. The JCPRP Training course consists of two modules, which are delivered jointly. Module 1 is a 3 day course co-ordinated and delivered jointly by NSW Department of Communities and Justice (DCJ), NSW Health and the NSW Police Service. The training largely focuses on the preparation for the investigative interview and interagency work. The second module for all three agencies is a 1 day Simulation exercise focussing on interagency collaboration.</p> <p>To be eligible to register for JCPRP training through ECAV, you must be employed as a JCPRP SHC/HC, JCPRP SHC Manager or in a role where you provide backfill to the JRU Managers' Table. JCPRP SHC/HCs are also required to complete the ECAV Course <i>Integrated responses to interpersonal violence, abuse and neglect (Part 1) and IN-1018 'Developing culturally safe trauma informed practice in Aboriginal communities'</i>.</p> <p>Other Health workers employed in Sexual Assault, Newstreet or Child Protection Counselling Services are also eligible to apply.</p>
